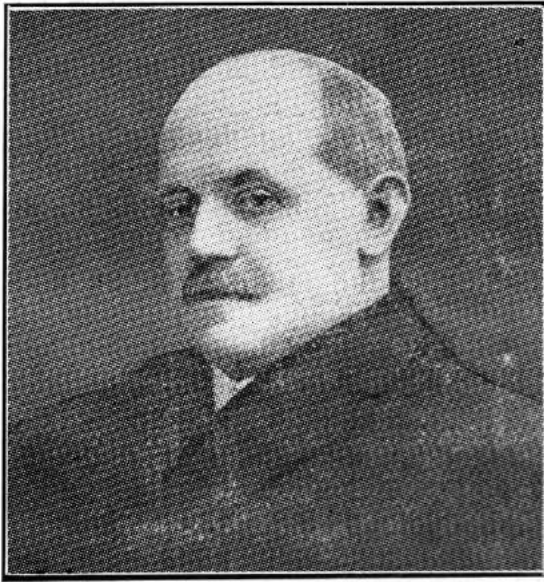

# A Brief History of Ebenezer Church 1882———1911

## **Rev. WILLIAM CLOUGH**

**T**HE year 1882 was a noted one for the faithful worshippers of "Zion Chapel", Field Lane. Four years previously, 600 square yards of land had been purchased on which to erect the building known as Ebenezer Church.

The Foundation Stones were laid on 24th April, 1882, the opening of the Church taking place on 5th November, following. The building comprised the Church and Minister's Vestry attached, with Schoolroom and classrooms adjoining underneath. The members were all working people, but they had been trained in systematic giving and by great sacrifice and united effort the debt was quickly cleared.

Congregations increased, new scholars were registered, and additional members enrolled. The varied agencies of the Church were vigorously sustained in an effort to meet the spiritual necessities of the increased population. Still the Church felt that the demands of the district were not being met. The pastoral work was lacking, the workers being unable to give sufficient time for this necessary visitation. On 5th April, 1891, Rev. William Clough was appointed Pastor, an office he worthily filled for 25 years until his death in August, 1916. "He being dead yet speaketh."

The history of the Church marks no settling down, no disposition to stand still. Something attempted, something done was no excuse for repose. Further tasks were undertaken. In 1892 a gallery was added in the Church and other improvements. A determined effort was made three years later to clear off the remaining debt £215. This being accomplished, the Annual Church Meeting on 1st January, 1896 recorded a minute expressing gratitude to God for His goodness and for the great liberality of the members in clearing off the debt. The same year the Extension Fund was established, reaching in ten years £600.

Insufficient schoolroom accommodation now created another problem and extension was urgent. Available land at the rear of the Church was purchased in 1905 and on 26th December, two years later, the Foundation Stones of the Lecture Hall, with classrooms underneath were laid, at the same time other alterations being made. [In 1909 two houses in King Street were purchased and one year later improvements to the boundary and street widening were effected. Following this, in 1911, a new Organ was installed, necessitating extensive alterations to the the Rostrum and Choir seats, besides other improvements to the premises.]

The following two years 1909-1911 is recorded :

# A Brief History of Ebenezer Church 1912—1932

THE period commencing with 1912 was a very quiet one, as this church was suffering, like many other churches by the loss of some of its active members, through removals, but the work was proceeding steadily. The chief item of interest was the official opening of the organ, on 18th January, 1912.

The year 1914 the Great War commenced and during the war period 250 persons who had had connection with the school or church joined the forces, and during 1918 a carved oak frame containing the Roll of Honour, was unveiled by the late Sir Joseph Walton.

In the year 1917, Rev. S. J. Smith was appointed Pastor, commencing his duties in December when eight Stained Glass Windows were unveiled, also a Carved Oak Pulpit, five Oak Chairs, and an Oak Communion Table which had been bequeathed by the late Pastor, Rev. W. Clough. In the year 1918 the Women's Auxiliary was constituted which has, since then, been a real help to the Church.

In the year 1921 the Rev. W. C. Smith was appointed Pastor. This was also the Diamond Jubilee year, and special events took place on Thursday, 16th December this being the date of the 60th Anniversary of the Formation of the Church. During this year, the Young Men's Institute (which commenced in 1909) was reorganised, and is now carried on in a separate building at the rear of the church, which is open every week-day for social intercourse and fellowship.

In the year 1926 the Church and School were renovated and re-decorated, also Electric Lighting was installed. In May 1927 the Rev. W. H. Jones was unanimously invited to the Pastorate, who after very careful thought and prayer accepted the invitation, and commenced his duties on 8th January, 1928. The Rev. W. H. Jones came from St. Just Circuit in Cornwall as a stranger, but with very strong recommendations, and to-day has the confidence and esteem of the Church and neighbourhood. He is a member of the Wesleyan Reform Union General Committee, Secretary of the Barnsley Free Church Council, on the Executive of the Barnsley & District Sunday School Union, and Ex-President of the Barnsley & District Christian Endeavour Society. In 1927, a house was purchased known as "The Manse" where the Pastor resides. Our next improvement was the construction of a wall at the rear of the Church. As we take a retrospective view, we realize great things have been accomplished, but as we look to the future we are confident the best is yet to be. This will need our prayers, loyal service, and sacrifice, and as the strength of a chain is known by its weakest link, it is up to every one of us to make the link that should bind the past with the future stronger, so may we in a like manner hand on this beautiful church not impaired or spoiled, but by faith beautified, and treasured as a House of God.
